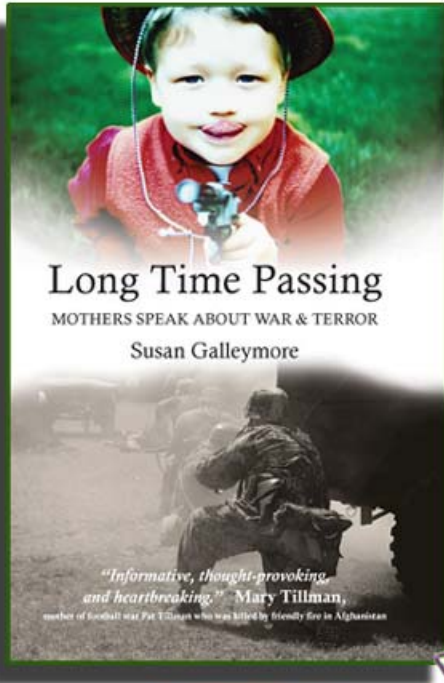


An Afternoon with Author Susan Galleymore
